Unlimited vertical meters, small groups of 4 guests per guide and accommodation at a beautiful wilderness lodge make the trip a true adventure. Enjoy the powder snow and live your dream.

6 days pre-heliski in renowned ski resorts in the Rocky Mountains and 4 or 6 days of heliskiing near Glacier National Park

PRE HELISKIING/BOARDING PROGRAM

DAY 1: CALGARY – Arrival at Calgary airport in the afternoon. Pick up your rental car and drive to Banff in the National Park where you spend 2 nights.

DAY 2: SUNSHINE VILLAGE – After breakfast you drive to your first ski area, Sunshine Village, which is located 20 minutes from Banff. Get used to the Rocky Mountain snow conditions and enjoy the beautiful scenery 2000 meters above sea leavel. You return to your hotel in the evening after a great day of skiing/snowboarding.

Day 3 - 5: Lake Louise – In the evening of day 3 you arrive at the next ski resort in Lake Louise where you spend 3 nights.

Experience double black diamond ski-runs and "packed-powder" on very steep ski-runs. Louise is the perfect spot to get prepared for full days of heliskiing/heliboarding. You will be ready for the adventure and excited to

experience the real wilderness.

After a hearty breakfast and after completing the usual formalities, you will receive security details on heliskiing/boarding and how to get in and out of the helicopter. Your adventure starts around 10:30am.

DAY 6/7: KICKING HORSE – You leave Banff National Park and get to Yoho National Park which means you enter the western province of British Columbia. Your next ski area is Kicking Horse which is located ouside of the Park and north of Golden. Enjoy two days of skiing/snowboarding at this very beautiful ski resort. Overnight on the mountain at a cozy wilderness lodge.

HELISKIING/BOARDING PROGRAM

DAY 8: HELISKIING - You get picked up by a member of the heliskiing company and go to your Mountain Lodge near Roger Pass in Glacier National Park. If you have a rental car you may want to keep the car and drive to the lodge yourself. In the evening, your guide will give you all details about the upcoming days and you will choose your skis and snowboards.

DAY 9: POWDER SNOW - HERE WE COME -

DAY 9 – (12) 14: HELISKIING AT ITS FINEST – Be prepared for (4) 6 amazing and exciting days with no elevation gain restrictions in this area and the greatest powder snow in the world. You will experience runs with different ratings. A Star B2 Helicopter picks you up directly at the lodge and at the end of your runs. One helicopter offers space for 6 people which means that it is only you up there, three of your friends, the guide and the pilot. This saves a lot of time and you have more flexibility.

Lunch is served outdoors in the wilderness with great views of the area. If it is a little bit chilly, you will hide in sheltered passages. In the evening you can relax in the hot tub or book a massage.

DAY (13) 15: DEPARTURE – In the morning you leave the lodge with unforgettable memories. You get dropped off at Calgary airport before 1pm. Depending on your plans, you fly home directly or stay the night in Calgary.

Included:

- Ski passes for Sunshine (1), Kicking Horse (2) and Lake Louise (3)
- 12 days of car rental (midsize sport utility)
- 7 nights hotel accommodation based on double occupancy
- 6/4 days of heliskiing/boarding in small groups (max. 4 riders plus 1 professionel guide per group); unlimited number of elevation gains; safety equipment; rental of special powder-skis/snowboards
- 7/4 nights accommodation at the Heliski Lodge, based on double occupancy
- All meals at the lodge
- Transport: Calgary airport lodge and return if car is returned in Calgary

Not included:

- Air fare
- Additional nights in Calgary before or after the heliski trip
- taxes

Time for travel:

Mid December to Mid April.

Rates vary depending on the season. Usually, prices are less expensive at the beginning and the end of the season. High season for heliski is February and March.
